#8, final words, I Jn 5:13-21

The impact of James' teaching was again brought home to the readers of John's letter. They recalled the account from Acts 15:13-14, After they had stopped speaking, James answered, saying, "Brethren, listen to me. 14" Simeon has related how God first concerned Himself about taking from among the Gentiles a people for His name. "A people for His name!" It had started when they accepted Christ as their personnel savior. As the word spread about their new faith, their family and friends became more and more hostile to them. However, they soon found a new family and new friends with whom they fellowshipped. Even in the midst of persecution they had the encouragement of each other. And then those new teachers came along with that strange message about Christ having not come in the flesh. The intense hurt started all over again. John wrote of this when he penned, I John 2:18, They went out from us, but they were not really of us; for if they had been of us, they would have remained with us; but they went out, so that it would be shown that they all are not of us. When one meditated on John's words, the truth of "A people for His name!" was made more and more real.

13 These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

14 This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. 15 And if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him.

16 If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask and God will for him give life to those who commit sin not leading to death. There is a sin leading to death; I do not say that he should make request for this. 17 All unrighteousness is sin, and there is a sin not leading to death.

[14.] v: 19 again, the whole world, This verse mentions two groups. What are the two groups?

NT:2889 (*kos'-mos*); probably from the base of NT:2865; orderly arrangement, i.e. decoration; by implication, the world (in a wide or narrow sense, including its inhabitants, literally or figuratively [morally]):
