
Events of I & II Samuel



- [1.] How old was Samuel when he anointed Saul king?
- [2.] How many years did Saul reign?
- [3.] How many years did David reign?

XTRA credit, How old, do you think, David was when Samuel anointed him king? remember, (ruddy, with beautiful eyes and a handsome appearance) and has taken out a lion & bear (I Sam 17:34-36).

David anointed king of Israel

I Sam 16:1, Now the Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul, since I have rejected him from being king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and go; I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehemite, for I have selected a king for Myself among his sons."..... 12 So he sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, with beautiful eyes and a handsome appearance. And the Lord said, "Arise, anoint him; for this is he." 13 Then Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the midst of his brothers; and the Spirit of the Lord came mightily upon David from that day forward. And Samuel arose and went to Ramah.

I Sam 28:17, "The Lord has done accordingly as He spoke through me; for the Lord has torn the kingdom out of your hand and given it to your neighbor, to David.

[4.] 16:1 & 28:17, "I have rejected him from being king over Israel", who was rejected?

anoint, (4886); a primitive root; to rub with oil, i.e. to anoint; by implication, to consecrate; also to paint:

KJV - anoint, paint.

Lesson #1, Introduction

I Sam 31:1-6, Now the Philistines were fighting against Israel, and the men of Israel fled from before the Philistines and fell slain on Mount Gilboa. 2 The Philistines overtook Saul and his sons; and the Philistines killed Jonathan and Abinadab and Malchi-shua the sons of Saul. 6 Thus Saul died with his three sons, his armor bearer, and all his men on that day together.

[5.] I Sam 31:2 relates the Philistines killing of Saul and his sons. If one of Saul's sons was not killed, did God intend Saul's surviving son to be king?


MAP FUN!
