David contemplated the terms of God's great covenant with him. Especially did the promises of that covenant brighten his last days with hope for the future. We too, all who are recipients of the glorious promises of the New Covenant in Christ, should meditate upon exquisite hope that awaits us in the coming kingdom. It is to easy to close out our days sinking into a bog of regrets for sins of which we long ago repented, or enumerating the pains and weaknesses which intensify and accumulate in greater number as we age. Our eyes should be lifted up to a delectable future highlighted by the promises of God. 1
