#11, two fathers – I Peter 1:23-25

The small group of believers in Caesarea had just witnessed all of God's plan involved in the new creation. They had already seen Jews come to be born again. But here was something different! Gentiles born again! It is little wonder they were amazed as recorded in Acts 10:45, All the circumcised believers who came with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also.

After this event, Peter clearly defined being born again in his first epistle. He was writing to persecuted believers that had been scattered telling them that they were not being persecuted for being Jews. The persecution came to them because they were followers of Christ.

This study of "two fathers" will help us as Christians to understand the complete miracle of what happened at Caesarea and the astounding facts about what it is to be "born again".

The difficulty for us, as "born again", is the fact that God in His infinite wisdom, chose to place what we are, as "born again", in the old container!

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Gen 3:20, Now the man called his wife's name Eve (life giver), because she was the mother of all the living.

Acts 17:26, "and He made from one man (Adam) every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined their appointed times and the boundaries of their habitation,"

Gen 5:5, So all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years, and he died.

I Cor 15:22a, in Adam all die,

1 Peter 1:3-4a, Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His great mercy has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 to obtain an inheritance which is imperishable [1.] Gen 3:20 & Acts 17:26, every nation of mankind, Describe, in your own words, where you and I are all originally from?


