
## 4, on to Nineveh, Jonah 3:1-10

Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time, saying, 2 "Arise, go to Nineveh . It had been a very difficult experience. The disobedience, the storm and the fish but now Jonah felt that he was finally on track!

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"Ninevah, a famous ancient city situated on the eastern bank of the Tigris River. In 612 BC the ancient, splendid city and capital of the Assyrian Empire was so completely obliterated, according to it's prophesied decimation by Hebrew prophets, that it became a myth until it's discovery in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The site has now been extensively excavated. The actual walled city has been outlined to indicate an area three miles in length and less than a mile and a-half in breadth.

[10.] v:5 again, from the greatest to the least of them, How would you define this phrase?

6 When the word reached the king of Nineveh, he arose from his throne, laid aside his robe from him, covered himself with sackcloth and sat on the ashes. 7 He issued a proclamation and it said, "In Nineveh by the decree of the king and his nobles: Do not let man, beast, herd, or flock taste a thing. Do not let them eat or drink water. 8 "But both man and beast must be covered with sackcloth; and let men call on God earnestly (mightily, urgently) that each may turn from his wicked way and from the violence which is in his hands.
