Gen 40:1, Then it came about after these things, the cupbearer and the baker for the king of Egypt offended their lord, the king of Egypt.	[1.] v:1-2, the king of Egypt. What else is this person called?
2 Pharaoh was furious with his two officials, the chief cupbearer and the chief baker. 3 So he put them in <u>confinement in the house of the captain of</u> <u>the bodyguard, in the jail</u> , the same place where Joseph was imprisoned.	[2.] v:1-2 again, was furious, What ever happened, this guy lost it! What does it take for you, a twice born Christian, to become angry?
4 The captain of the bodyguard put Joseph in charge of them, and he took care of them; and they were in confinement for some time.	[3.] v:4, put Joseph in charge of them, What were Joseph's credentials?
	[4.] v:4 again, and he took care of them What might Joseph have done?
	[5.] question [4.], Why is it not easy to look after the needs of any one?
5 Then the cupbearer and the baker for the king of Egypt, who were confined in jail, both had a dream the same night, each man with his own dream and each dream with its own interpretation.	[6.] v:5, both had a dream, Explain why this is either dumb luck or the providence of God?
6 When Joseph came to them in the morning and observed them, behold, they were dejected. 7 He asked Pharaoh's officials who were with him in confinement in his master's house, "Why are your faces so sad today?"	[7.] v:6-7, dejected How would Joseph conclude that they were probably "more" dejected than usual?

8 Then they said to him, "We have had a dream and there is no one to interpret it." Then Joseph said to them, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell it to me, please."

9 So the chief cupbearer told his dream to Joseph, and said to him, "In my dream, behold, there was a vine in front of me; 10 and on the vine were three branches. And as it was budding, its blossoms came out, and its clusters produced ripe grapes. 11 "Now Pharaoh's cup was in my hand; so I took the grapes and squeezed them into Pharaoh's cup, and I put the cup into Pharaoh's hand." 12 Then Joseph said to him, "This is the interpretation of it: the three branches are three days; 13 within three more days Pharaoh will lift up your head and restore you to your office; and you will put Pharaoh's cup into his hand according to your former custom when you were his cupbearer. 14 "Only keep me in mind when it goes well with you, and please do me a kindness by mentioning me to Pharaoh and get me out of this house. 15 "For I was in fact kidnapped from the land of the Hebrews, and even here I have done nothing that they should have put me into the dungeon."

16 When the chief baker saw that he had interpreted favorably, he said to Joseph, "I also saw in my dream, and behold, there were three baskets of white bread on my head; 17 and in the top basket there were some of all sorts of baked food for Pharaoh, and the birds were eating them out of the basket on my head."
