# letters to Thessalonica

#4, waiting, I Thess 3:1-13

The subject or far context of this lesson could really have started back in I Thess 2:17, But we, brethren, having been taken away from you for a short while - in person, not in spirit - were all the more eager with great desire to see your face.

The team had been whisked out of Thessalonica – out of harm. Paul, in this chapter, writes about his concerns for the believers in Thessalonica, while he waits in Athens.

Before we get into this lesson, let's do a little exercise. Paul uses the term "we", meaning himself and someone else. Sometimes the team (Paul, Silas and Timothy) gets split up making it difficult to determine who "we" actually is. Using Acts 17:10-15 & I Thess 3:2, answer the following questions.

[1.] Who was sent to Berea? Who don't we know about? [2.] From Berea, who was sent to the coast? Who stayed at Berea? [3.] Who was taken to Athens? Who was commanded by Paul to come to Athens? [4.] Where was Silas when Paul waited in Athens? Who was commanded to go back to Thessalonica from Athens? [5.] What do you feel about Paul sending a team member back into danger and not go himself or put another way, why was it safer for the team member than for Paul?

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13 so that He may establish your hearts without blame in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His saints. [19.] v:13, so that He, This verse tells us that God is working in us 24/7. What is God doing?

[20.] v:13 again, What can we do to greatly hinder God's work in our lives?
